Attendance Update

Attendance for students with SEND at City Academy continues to be strong and is currently at **89.98% - above national average of 86% and up on last week by 0.4%**. Your hard work is vital on getting students here and on time, thank you. I am hoping to report a push into 90% and beyond from next week.

Year 11 Intervention – P6

Year 11 Intervention has continued with excellent attendance and a rigorous attitude to additional intervention. This is supplemented by 1:1 support provided by the SEND team on subjects such as English, Maths and Science. Reviewing of Passes for January 2026

As a school, we currently use a range of passes to support students, including:

- Time-out passes
- Early leave passes
- Lift passes
- Medical passes
- Toilet passes

Over time, the number of passes in circulation has increased significantly. This has led to some inconsistency and, at times, an over-reliance on passes rather than classroom strategies and resilience building. We are therefore reviewing our whole-school approach to passes for January 2026. Our aim is to:

- Ensure long-term medical and toilet passes are supported by medical evidence
- Put in place a fair and consistent system
- Help students to develop independence and resilience over time
- Replace most current passes with a more efficient and sustainable system

A consultation will be sent to families in the next week, and your views will be extremely important in shaping this approach.

DLD Together Course for Parents/Carers

This Autumn Term there is a free “Secondary DLD Together” course for parents and carers of secondary school children with a diagnosis of Developmental Language Disorder (DLD).

The course was created by Afasic and NAPLIC and supports families to better understand and support their child’s language needs at home and in school.

International Day of Disabilities (IDOD) 3rd December 2025

The 3rd of December is the IDOD day that is celebrated by UNICEF and around the globe as we focus on this year’s theme of ‘Access to all’ . This has been communicated to our students in assemblies this week as they look to develop inclusive minds at school and in the wider community.
