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As we end this school year, I wanted to take this opportunity to thank you for your continued support and to celebrate the successes we have seen this academic year in terms of your child and the school.

On Friday 18th July, school will finish at 12.25pm. There will be a phased release of students, beginning at 12.00pm and we will be encouraging students to return home directly at the end of the school day.

This year at City Academy has seen us successfully continue to embed our Opportunities offer. It has been fantastic to see our students engage in such a wide variety of extra-curricular activities and we have seen our offer grow throughout the year. We are pleased that our breakfast club provision has seen such interest from students and their families and enjoy seeing them from 7.45am every morning for sport, breakfast, revision, homework and socialising. This year has also seen a further development of our students as leaders in many areas, so, please speak with your child about our opportunities for student leadership in the new school year and encourage them to apply.

Our biggest success this year, is our students and their continued dedication to their successful futures. I am always impressed, as I walk the corridors during lessons and see your child hard at work. The support we have seen from families at events throughout the year, including parents evening and showcases has demonstrated your continued commitment to your child's future. I am immensely proud of everything we are doing, and long may this continue, and I look forward to the further improvements we will see next year.

Studies have shown the importance of retrieval practice and revision as excellent ways to store learning in a person's long-term memory, a skill crucial for future success. To aid students with this we have purchased a subscription to GCSE Pod for all students in Year 11 and Year 10 to support them. GCSE Pod is an online library of content and information in the subjects that your child studies.

It will be used by teachers to set tasks and homework for students but should also be used by students as an independent revision tool. We have given each student in Year 10 a tutorial of how to use GCSE Pod and get the most from it, ready for Year 11. If your child was absent or late on the day of this, they can go to the website and click "get started" in the login section to activate their account. 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In the new term we will Introduce Year 9 (who will then be Year 10) to this platform and ensure they know how to use it. If your child is in years 7, 8 or 9, we encourage them to keep reviewing their learning over the break to ensure they retain all learning into the new year. They will continue to have access to platforms such as Educake, Sparx Maths and Reading Plus.

This term has seen our year 11 students successfully complete their GCSE exams, with us saying goodbye, for now, on Friday 20th June. We look forward to seeing them on Thursday 21st August for results day.

Students in year 11 and their parents/carers are welcome to come into school, to the school site at Langley Walk, to collect their GCSE results on Thursday 21st August between 9.00am – 11.30pm, entering through the entrance on Cregoe Street. Staff, senior leaders and careers advisors will be on hand to give students any advice and support they need as they take their next steps. If you are unable to come into school, please contact us, so we can make arrangements to get your results to you.

We know that the summer can be a challenge to some families. Bring it on Brum (BIOB) is a Birmingham holiday activities program for children who receive Free School Meals (FSM). There are a wide range of activities taking place across the city and include indoor and outdoor games, sports activities, arts and crafts and much more. Living in the second largest city in the UK can bring many challenges for young people and it goes without saying that we want your children to be safe during the school holidays. To keep your children safe we have a variety of partnerships including West Midlands Police (WMP). It has been brought to our attention that a number of children and young people across the city have been stopped and searched. This is for your child's safety and that of the community.

The safety and welfare of the school community at City Academy is paramount and we are committed to protecting all students from harm. All staff are trained in Child Protection procedures, and we have a number of Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSL's). As parents, carers, and members of the school community it is important that you are aware of hot topics and issues that are encountered every day by children and young people in Birmingham.

You will be receiving a summer letter from the West Midlands Police which contains important information about how to keep children, young people and families safe over the 6-week holiday period.
