Dear Parents/Carers and Students of City Academy,

As the weather becomes cold and wintry, I urge all students to dress appropriately for school by wearing a coat. Cold weather is not a reason for not attending school, unless the school is closed due to extreme snow, I expect all students to attend school as normal.

Attendance has significantly improved recently, which is extremely pleasing, and must now be maintained. What we must aim for is to reduce the number of students who are late, especially those arriving after 9:00am.

## Uniform

Thank you to all students for looking so smart with the correct uniform. Please maintain this standard throughout the year. Our expectations for uniform will be extremely high this year so please ensure you leave home each morning correctly dressed. Any student with incorrect uniform will be given a replacement in the morning until the matter is rectified or your parents/carer will be contacted to come in and drop off the item.

Our uniform expectations are detailed below.

# Wearing hooded tops in school

Hooded tops are not part of our school uniform and should not be worn in school. All students should have a blazer, which should be worn throughout the day. During the colder weather, students should be wearing an outdoor coat however these must be taken off once inside the building. If any family is struggling to afford a coat for their child, they should contact their Head of Year or Year Group Coordinator as we may be able to help.

# **Prepared for learning**

Each day students should attend school ready to learn. This includes having the correct equipment - pen, pencil, and ruler as a minimum. Each morning, Form Tutors will check that students have these items with them. I would recommend students get their bag ready the night before, with equipment, any completed homework and PE kit if necessary. We will shortly be asking all students to place their equipment on 'equipment mats' during form time — more information will be given to you about this soon.

## Next steps for Year 11

This week we have begun offering additional opportunities for Year 11 to help prepare them for next summer's examinations. I am delighted with the attendance at period 6 lessons, 109 attended mathematics, and 114 attended science - well done Year 11. Year 11 students will also have the opportunity to work in the library at lunchtime - but like in all libraries, there must be a quiet working atmosphere, sometimes this week it has been too noisy. Impress the examiner sessions are also being started for students on Saturdays- if you are given the opportunity to attend, please ensure that you do - it will provide essential revision for you.

# Headscarf (optional)

- Plain navy blue or black

#### Blazer

- Navy blue jacket with school logo
- Must be worn when walking around the building (can be taken off in classrooms with staff permission)

# Jumper (optional)

 Plain grey V-necked jumper (no logo)

# **Skirt/Trousers**

- Plain grey skirt or trousers (not too tight)
- Skirt must be at least knee length
- Skirt must be appropriate fit and not be jersey material
- No leggings

Uniform must be worn correctly, including on the journey to and from school

#### Shirt & Tie

- Light blue shirt with top button done up at all times
- Tie must be waist length

#### **Trousers**

- Plain grey trousers
- No skinny fit trousers or jeans

#### Shoes

- Smart plain black shoes
- No trainer style shoes

#### Accessories & Jewellery

- 2 pairs of studs, sleepers or small earrings are allowed
- 1 simple small ring is allowed
- 1 discreet nose stud is allowed
- No heavy makeup (must be discreet)
- Nails allowed to be painted one colour (nail extensions are not allowed)
