Dear Parents/Carers

I am pleased to report the behaviour data for this week. There are 325 students that have received no negative behaviour points this week, and 563 students who have received positive behaviour points. This week has been a very busy week at City Academy, with Year 11 mock examinations, Year 6 Open Evening on Wednesday, and Opportunity Day today.

Year 11 have now completed their first set of mock exams this academic year. The majority of students have displayed their dedication and maturity throughout the week, and we are confident this will be evident in the results that are produced. We do mock exams for a number of reasons, including:

- to support students with their preparation for the summer exams by them having a true experience of formal exams before their GCSEs,
- so, teachers can see the progress that has been made, but more importantly to highlight any gaps in knowledge, so that teachers can plan to close the gaps before the next mocks in January,
- to demonstrate to students how much more they know and that their hard work and dedication is making a difference.
- identifying any students that we feel may benefit from us applying for extra support for them, through exam access arrangements.

We look forward to the results that will be shared during Parents Evening on Thursday 23rd November, between 4:30 and 6:30pm.

We would like to thank all families who supported Open Evening on Wednesday by allowing their children to act as guides or helpers for the event. The number of students that volunteered to be a part of the evening was overwhelming and a credit to us and to you. It demonstrates how proud they are of their school and that they like showing it to others. We will continue to welcome families next week for tours daily between 9 and 10am, to showcase the school when we are fully operational to demonstrate how dedicated our students are to their learning and our staff are to teaching and supporting young people.

Today was the first Opportunity Day of the year. It saw students in year 7-10 visiting venues and learning experiences across the country. Below are the details of the visits:

- Year 8 visited Thinktank.
- Year 9 visited Old Trafford trip.
- Year 10 history students visited Warwick Castle.
