At City Academy, we prioritise the safety, well-being, and dignity of all individuals within our community. Safeguarding is central to the work of City Academy and underpins our CORE values. All staff have a responsibility to safeguard students and are committed to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all. There are sixteen Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSL) who are trained to identify children and families who need early help and require support. They work with a range of external agencies to ensure all students are safe, ensuring there is wrap-around support available during the school holidays. These agencies include Birmingham Children's Trust and West Midlands Police.

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Police and Schools panel (West Midlands Police):

At City Academy we value work with our external partners and particularly West Midlands Police. We regularly share information with each other to ensure our students are safeguarded and kept from harm. A Senior Leader from City Academy regularly attends the Police and Schools' panel. Here, our team are updated with the latest trends and updates that could affect young people. This allows us to be proactive in our pastoral care providing the education our young people need to stay safe, inside and outside of the Academy.

Online Safety:

At City Academy we use filtering and monitoring systems; Netsweeper and SENSO to keep students safe online. DSLs are alerted when students are thought to be unsafe so that all concerns can addressed. This week at City Academy our School Intervention Protection Officers (SIPO) have delivered assemblies to all year groups about Online Safety.

Personal Development Curriculum:

Each Friday during Period 1, students at City Academy have a lesson on Personal Development (PSHE). In these lessons we cover a wide variety of topics, which help to prepare children for life beyond City Academy. These topics come under three broad areas Health and wellbeing, Living in the wider world and Relationships. The curriculum is designed to meet the needs of our students and is designed to support them with many of the challenges they may face and need to be equipped to tackle. A large part of this curriculum is all about how children can keep themselves safe and happy, both in school and in the community. Within this, we cover:

- Healthy relationships
- Safety in the community
- Healthy lifestyles (including drugs and alcohol abuse)
- Respect and Individual rights

In addition to the PSHE curriculum, we run weekly assemblies. These are led by our staff on a variety of topics and many of these are connected to national days of awareness such as World Children Day, Anti Bullying Week, Safer Internet Day and Human Rights Day. We have several established partnerships who support us with delivery of certain topics. One of these is the Police, who will deliver assemblies this year on "Social Media and the law" and "Youth violence".

Mentoring:

At City Academy we work with several mentoring providers including Antonio and Jay from MADE Mentors, Football Beyond Borders and Free 2 Dream. Mentoring is tailored to suit the individual needs of the student, and each provider can offer our students something different, ensuring students receive the right support for them. 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
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SHARP System:

The Sharp System is a tool available to City Academy students who wish to relay any problems, both in and out of school. Issues can be raised with confidentiality by students and is checked daily by our Lead DSL and relayed through the Pastoral Team to ensure every student voice is heard and every need addressed as much as humanly possible to keep our children safe and to maximise their chances of reaching their potential.

The Sharp System is available on the City Academy website through 'Student Links' and all students need to click is the "make report" button (see below) or is available on the Google Play Store/Apple App Store for students to download to mobile device.
