I am pleased to report the behaviour data for this week. There are 359 students that have received no negative behaviour points this week, and 620 students who have received positive behaviour points. As part of this drive, we want all City Academy students to be able to access and borrow books from Birmingham Library/their local libraries; not only to access texts essential to their studies, but to develop a love of reading for pleasure. Road Safety

Safeguarding your children while in our care is our absolute priority. So, it is only natural that this would extend to their movement into and out of the academy. You will be aware that City Academy, at the centre of Birmingham, is surrounded by bustling traffic on a dual carriageway at the time pupils are travelling to and leaving school. The Senior Leadership Team and duty staff have noticed a rise in pupils putting themselves at risk by failing to use the crossing (which has traffic lights); choosing to cross in more dangerous areas, like the middle of the road, and running across the road while the traffic lights are on green, forcing cars to emergency stop. Our care for your child/children makes witnessing incidents like this very concerning and worrying. Within the academy, we will be reminding students of the importance of road safety and crossing appropriately, but we would also appreciate your support in this by reinforcing this message and impressing the importance of safety on the roads to your child/children over the coming days/weekend.
